March 2017 Quarterly Activity Report

Gold developer Bassari Resources Limited (ASX: BSR) is pleased to report on activities at its gold projects in Senegal, West Africa.

Makabingui Gold Project

- Corporate
 - Placements during the quarter raise \$0.7 million
 - Placement subsequent to the end of the quarter raised \$1.1 million before costs

MAKABINGUI GOLD PROJECT

During the quarter, the company continued with the first phase of the Makabingui Gold Project development.

Following the approval of the project's Exploitation Licence, the Presidential Decree is required, however the project team has proceeded with preliminary work for project infrastructure, mining and processing plant construction.

At the same time, candidates for the project team are being canvassed and the 2014 Feasibility Study scope and planning for the project is being optimized and updated for recently improved capital and operating cost items.

While this study was sufficient for a technical and economic assessment of the project viability and confirmed the upside potential of the project below the present pit design, more detail is being prepared for those areas that require precise planning and scheduling, such as a month by month outline of the mine ore and waste movements for the mining contract.

A detailed mine design will be undertaken following the completion of the 4,025m RC infill and resource grade control drilling program of the Makabingui Gold Deposit. This grade control program is on a 25m x 25m grid in Pits 1 and 2 and is expected to confirm and extend the mineralisation along the interpreted plunge of the high grade mineralised zones located on intersection of the main host structures with cross faults. The grade control infill drilling program is the first stage in the development of the high grade Makabingui Gold deposit. Drilling started on the 28 January 2017 at Pit 1 with a Senegalese drilling company and to the end of the March quarter 38 holes totalling 1,941m had been completed and 2,022 samples sent for assay.

Some preliminary assay results have been received and reported in ASX announcements 29 March 2017 and subsequent to the end of the quarter on 26 April 2017.

A number of project financing options, including a finance term sheet are under review by management and this process continues to ensure the best financing outcome is achieved. Due diligence processes by financiers continues.

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Fund Raising

Placements during the March quarter at \$0.03 (3.0 cents) per ordinary share raised approximately \$0.7 million before costs to provide working capital and funds to further progress the development phase of the Makabingui Gold Project including a reverse circulation (RC) infill and grade control drilling program in Pits 1 and 2 of the Makabingui Gold deposit.

Subsequent to the end of the quarter a significant placement of \$1.1 million was made at \$0.0175 (1.75 cents) per ordinary share. This key investment strengthens the Company's liquidity in the lead up to the Makabingui Gold Project development.

Annual General Meeting

The Company Annual General Meeting will be held at RACV City Club, 501 Bourke Street Melbourne at 10:30 am on Wednesday 31 May 2017. The Notice of Meeting will be despatched to all shareholders early next week.

About Bassari

Melbourne - based West African gold developer Bassari Resources Limited (ASX:BSR) has a strategic portfolio of exploration permits focused on the Birimian Gold Belt in Senegal. The permits cover an area of 790 km² with 80km of strike along the combined three contiguous permits. The permits are located within the Kenieba Inlier which is a +60M ounce gold region. Bassari's vision is to discover and delineate gold resources which can be developed into profitable operations.
